Q. What charges will I have to pay in addition to the charter fee and the nightly Deductible Reduction Agreement Fee charged by CYOA?

A. There are several:

1. Food and Beverages
2. Fuel at the end of the charter – currently about \$5.50 per US gallon
3. BVI Cruising Tax of \$4 per person per day that you are in the BVI
4. BVI Customs Exit Tax of \$5 per person
5. BVI Charter Boat Permit - \$45
6. National Parks Permit for use of moorings in park areas as follows:
 - Weekly Permit 4 persons or less \$50
 - Weekly Permit 6 persons or less \$70
 - Weekly Permit 8 persons or less \$90
 - Weekly Permit 10 persons or less \$110
7. BVI Harbor Dues estimated at \$15

US and BVI Customs and Immigration are open 365 days a year during normal business hours of about 8 to about 5 (island time).

- There are overtime charges assessed in the BVI if you arrive (that is if you tell the authorities that you physically arrived in the BVI at this time) any day after 3:30 PM or all day on Sunday and BVI Holidays. The overtime charge is \$20.
- There are overtime charges in the USVI if you clear in or out on a Sunday or a Federal or Territorial Holiday. The charge is a maximum of \$25.
